## War Dead of North Newnton

## First World War

**Herbert James Barlow**: Serving in the 5th Battalion Wiltshire Regiment, he was killed in action in Mesopotamia on 18 April 1916, aged 18 years 6 months.

**Sidney J Blackman**: Lance Corporal in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion of the Wiltshire Regiment, died on the 11 April 1917, aged 27. His parents lived in Woodbridge.

**Ernest A Collins:** Private in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion Royal Warwickshire Regiment, died on the 27 August 1916 aged 34. Born in Bradford on Avon.

**Frederick H Ford**: Aged 20. Son of Robert Ford of Bottlesford Died 21/8/1915 Gallipoli Household Cavalry Number 1917

**Arthur H Gale**: Born: Hilcott 1877 Died: 16/8/1915 Gallipoli Royal Dublin Fusilliers Number 15327. He had 7 siblings and was a waggoner and lived with the Rose family.

**Albert Goodship**: Private in the 1<sup>st</sup> battalion of the Royal Berkshire regiment, died on the 20 June 1916 in Flanders. A farm labourer who lived in Pewsey and whose parents lived in Easton Royal.

**Ernest Pinchin**: Born: Wilsford 1895 Died: 23/7/1916 Flanders - Wiltshire Regiment Number 11271. A Farm Labourer

**John Herbert Pinchin**: Sergeant in B company 1<sup>st</sup> battalion of the Wiltshire regiment, died on the 23 October 1914

Samuel Razey: Private in the Leinster regiment, died 9 August 1915 aged 31. Lived in Bottlesford.

John Razey: Lance Corporal, died 25 September 1915 in Flanders Berkshire Regiment

**Henry C Rudman** Born: 1886. Died on 12 March 1915, 29 years old 1st battalion Wiltshire Regiment Number 9933. Farm labourer born in Bottlesford and lived in Hilcott

**Frederick John Stevens** of Hilcott – signalman RN, who died on 01 June 1916 at the battle of Jutland Age 21

## Second World War

**Charles Holloway**: Private in the 5<sup>th</sup> Battalion of the Wiltshire Regiment, died on 26 August 1944 in Normandy, aged 22. Born in Blunsdon, Swindon.

**Charles Stratton**: driver with the Royal Army Service Corps, died on the 19 November 1946 in the Middle East. His family came from Hilcott.
