- Update from Pewsey Vale West Wiltshire Councillor Paul Oatway QPM:

- 23/ Updates from Committees

**1: Hilcott Village Hall Committee:** Carolyn Whistler sent in the following update which was read by TM as part of the meeting:

'Now that the weather is kinder we will be starting to clear, tidy and level the ground at Barnard Meadow. A successful site survey has been carried out with an environmental assessment to follow. We shall use the grant funding we obtained from Local Giving for a skip to move the considerable amount of old rubbish from the land, and the matched funding from Pewsey Area Board for erection of fencing and gates on the site. We can then move forward with a plan for a car park and community space. We intend in due course to have benches with commemorative plaques for respected and worthy residents of North Newnton parish.'

2: St. James's Church, North Newnton: JB updated the council on the running costs of the church, totalling thousands of pounds a year. JB explained that St. James is trying to make the church more useful to the community. The running costs will remain covered by the normal church funds. Once the project is complete there will be no further costs. The church has spent £1000 on surveying the building, they have proposed a small addition at the back to hold a toilet near a kitchenette.

TM asked about where the waste from the toilet would go? JB explained that options for this have been discussed, one idea was a compostable toilet, but it has been agreed that it will be a cess pit. Many of the options are not allowed at the church because of the proximity to the river. The toilet will be accessed by exiting the church via the west door. This door is normally used for weddings. JB has approached Wiltshire Council, but no funding has been available so far. Councillors assured JB that the NNPC support the project.

**3: Clerk's Report:** RC reported that things had been relatively quiet since the last meeting in January 2023. RC had spent some time researching the broadband voucher scheme but all postcodes tried produced the message that this scheme was not available in this area. There was some information on the website that appeared to say that fibre broadband will be coming to the area in October to December 2023, but this was unclear. TM will investigate further to see if any more details can be found.

## 23/ Update from external meetings:

17 Pewsey LH&FIG: Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> January 2023:

TE attended. All is progressing well with the North Newnton Footpath Project, phase 2 was completed early. The estimated cost of phase 3 is £37,000, TE offered the section ringfenced £12,800 from the parish council if required.

TM praised PO for all his hard work and his commitment to this project.

TE also reported that the public should report problems with road markings to be re-done on the Wiltshire website and is not the responsibility of the parish council.

Town & Parishes/Wiltshire Council Meeting: Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2023 – No councillor could attend

Operational Flood Working Group Meeting: Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2023

TM attended and reported that the problem of pot holes is widely acknowledged and that the condition of the roads is worsening flood related problems.

**Pewsey Area Board:** Monday 27<sup>th</sup> February 2023

DB attended the meeting. DB stated that the discussion concerned physical spaces in the community which would become centre points in communities for if an emergency were to happen. This location will become the primary contact too.

AG acknowledged that this is likely to be a reaction to the Ukraine war and planning for any potential future conflicts. DB informed the council that for now they have been advised to stick with existing flooding and emergency plans.

The other topic of conversation was that Wiltshire require more foster carers in the county.

The fire and rescue service reported low incident numbers. The police reported a slight increase in crime, the new inspector also attended the meeting and introduced himself. The inspector reassured those at the meeting that road safety and speed reductions will be of top priority.

The parish council supports the celebration of the Coronation of King Charles III among the local communities and believes that it is up to individual parishioners & groups to celebrate this marvellous event in the way they so choose However, the council is not able to organise an event within the time frame available. TM proposed motion to not fund any celebrations especially as no requests for funds had been received, TE seconded, all voted in favour.
